The march, sponsored by Action Iowa County, will begin at 11 a.m. and will go down High Street. This is a non-partisan event so please invite your friends/family and neighbors.



Wed., March 14, 10 a.m. (Mineral Point, Dodgeville, Mt. Horeb, Spring Green) 17-minute NATIONAL SCHOOL WALKOUT. Join them.

Students at high schools in Dodgeville, Mineral Point, Spring Green and Mt. Horeb, among others, will "walk out" for 17 minutes of silence at 10 a.m. on Wed., March 14, in recognition of the 17 students and faculty who died in the Florida shooting. Community members are invited to join them.

Mon., March 19, 6 to 8 p.m. (Mineral Point) MEET THREE SCHOOL BOARD CANDIDATES at Tequila Point Please join other Action Iowa County Members to meet candidates Nate Chambers, Aaron Dunn and Everett Lindsey, who are all running for the April election for Mineral Point School Board. There are 3 open seats, and 4 candidates. The event will be held at Tequila Point, 43 High Street in Mineral Point (as was last year's Big Huddle). Drinks and light appetizes

Said one Grassroots member, "If we are able to elect Chambers, Dunn and Lindsey we can make sure that the Mineral Point school board reflects our community's values and sense of mutual respect. All 3 would be tremendous assets to our school board." A fourth candidate has been on the school board in recent years but has had difficulty showing his fellow board members and community members respect. He is running again, after being defeated last year.

The three invited candidates will make a brief statement at about 6:30 p.m. The rest of the event will be a casual meet-and-greet type event, with plenty of time for chatting about issues relevant to our schools.
