KATHLEEN FALK ANNOUNCES MARY LOUISE SYMON PRAIRIE The Dane County Park Commission has dedicated a prairie in honor of Mary Louise Symon. The prairie is in the process of restoration. The dedicated area is 48 acres and is part of the larger Ice Age Junction Natural Resource Area. The Ice Age Trail currently runs along the northern end of the dedicated area. A future bicycle/pedestrian trail may also go through the area. A small parking lot with a kiosk will be constructed in the future. The kiosk will include information on Mary Louise.
