<u>EVENT</u> Free help is available in Dodgeville for those who have not yet signed up for health insurance and may face a penalty on next year's taxes. If you have a friend or family member who still is without health insurance, urge them to come to this important event - to find out the facts about their particular situation. They may be eligible for BadgerCare and not know it. Rules have changed recently. Or they may be eligible for significant subsidies when they apply online at the HEALTHCARE.GOV site. THE SUPER SATURDAY SIGN UP EVENT will be held at the Southwest Tech computer lab in the Piggly Wiggly mall, 316 W. Spring. Enrollees should bring social security numbers and pay stubs for all wage earners in their household and/or 2013 tax returns.

<u>future</u>. The Uplands Garden Club is hosting this free event at Stonefield Apartment, 407 E. Madison St., where Stan Temple, a senior fellow at the Aldo Leopold Foundation, will share his career-long interest in the extinction

of the passenger pigeon. 2014 marked the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the passenger pigeon's extinction. During the year Temple gave 102 presentations on the pigeon in 20 states. Now he's coming to Dodgeville and will talk about the ecology and life history of the passenger pigeon and other extinct and endangered birds, current extinction crises, endangered species recovery, human relationship with wildlife, and sustainable use of biological resources. # THE COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS FREE CLINIC: a partner's profile

Many of our Grassroots members are among the hard-working volunteers at the Community Connections Free Clinic, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization based in Dodgeville. The Clinic provides basic health care for those who cannot afford to access medical services in Iowa County and surrounding areas. CCFC's guiding principle is that, together, we can eliminate the obstacles to health care in our community, one patient at a time. The Clinic is open Tuesday through Friday (10am-4pm) for nursing and medication visits, and Tuesday and Thursday evenings (4 p.m.-8pm) for physician, nurse practitioner and physician assistance visits. Patients are served on a first come first served basis. We are able to see patients who are uninsured and those having difficulty accessing primary care elsewhere. CCFC offers health assessments, primary care, limited diagnostic labs and x-rays, follow up care, prescription medications, health and nutrition education, referrals to other community resources, and Spanish interpreters for non-English speaking Hispanic patients.

Over the last year CCFC has been involved with our Grassroots Citizens in enrolling our friends and neighbors for BadgerCare or affordable policies through the online Healthcare Marketplace. We have Affordable Care Act (ACA) Assisters and support staff available by appointment on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We have seen many of our patients obtain insurance; however, there is still a population that is uninsured and seeks primary care at clinics such as CCFC.
