

In addition, <u>locally</u>, the Sustain group is monitoring the proposed high capacity power line expansion that will most likely cut through Iowa County, and they are exploring a possible partnership with Upland Hills Health to expand sustainability practices at the hospital. With UW Platteville they are exploring potential feasibility surveys for wind and solar power generation in selected Iowa county locations.
