GRASSROOTS 2013 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

<u>OUR HEALTH CARE TASK FORCE</u>, along with other partners, sponsored two health care-related free film screenings: <u>Escape Fire</u> and <u>Hungry for Change</u>. It also co-sponsored the presentation of "Keeping Iowa County Healthy: It's Everyone's Job" (more to come in 2014).

We were a co-sponsor of the Delicious Driftless Food Fare. Grassroots volunteers offered free help sessions to enroll people in the ACA Marketplace - and will continue to do so in 2014. Grassroots was part of the Info Sessions about the ACA held at the HS&S Building Community Room.

<u>OUR IMMIGRATION TASK FORCE</u> continued to sponsor a vibrant English-as-a-Second-Language tutoring program with other partners. We have now trained over 50 volunteers. Grassroots and others are working on establishing a southwest Wisconsin-based Multicultural Center.

<u>OUR SUSTAIN IOWA COUNTY</u> partner sponsored a months-long series of Climate Change advertisements in the <u>Dodgeville Chronicle</u> paid for by private businesses and individuals. The Climate Change Lobby group holds monthly meetings to consider solutions. Chuck Tennessen has begun a regular blog in the <u>Dodgeville Chronicle</u>. This group will co-sponsor the upcoming 2014 climate change series.

<u>OUR PEACE & JUSTICE</u> partners hosted the memorable 2013 Lanterns for Peace event, entitled "Making Peace with Nature" and were involved with the Dodgeville Library in a thought-provoking Great Decisions series.

<u>OUR MARY LOUISE SYMON AWARDS</u> committee presented two 2013 awards of \$1,000 each to local graduating high school seniors

<u>OUR FORUMS COMMITTEE</u> hosted the "Dare Your Run for Office?" event and a discussion with NPR's Steve Paulson about his captivated book <u>Atoms and Eden</u> - a series of interviews with leading science and religion experts.
