Some local people from my area will be in Washington on June 24 to talk to our Congressional representatives about important legislation dealing with global warming. I'd like to encourage the (Senator or Congressman) to meet with them. Please pass on this message. Thanks very much."

2014 MARY LOUISE SYMON AWARD WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Deborah Heth, a Mineral Point High School graduate, is the second 2014 award winner. These two young women were chosen because they have already shown a deep commitment to community services and plan to continue in this path in the years to come.

The community service award is presented annually in honor of Mary Louise Symon, a long-time resident of Spring Green, who died in late 2009. Throughout her life, Ms. Symon worked tirelessly to make courts more humane, ensure fair housing, protect the environment, preserve farmland and rural regions, and defend social services, among many other community activities. She was one of the founders of the Grassroots Citizens of Wisconsin and was a strong advocate of the role of citizens in a democracy.
