HELP "KICKSTART" LOCAL FOODS IN OUR SCHOOL Dr. Sarah Fox and Julie Stephenson, both Mineral Point moms, are tackling the issue of serving healthier local foods in the Mineral Point schools. With the enthusiastic support of school administrators, Sarah (a physician) and Julie (a nutrition educator and photographer) are writing a hard cover, full-color book called "Super Snacks for Super Kids," to be published by Little Creek Press, the Mineral Point publishing company owned by Kristin Mitchell. All proceeds will go to the Mineral Point Schools Wellness projects -- including a school garden, farm to school connections, a kids' triathlon and family cooking classes. Here's how you can help. To fund publishing costs, Sarah and Julie are using Kickstarter, a new online fund-raising tool. Click the hot link above to get full information. "We have 30 days to raise \$10,000 on Kickstarter. Otherwise we don't get anything," says Sarah, who is hoping 100 people will donate \$100 each. Smaller and larger donations are welcome as well. (If they don't reach the goal, all donations are returned to the giver.)

He's lobbying to require a 2/3 vote of the County Board or a public referendum on any future county bonding or borrowing project that costs in excess of \$1.7 million, knowing full well that such high hurdles are seldom met.
