Maureen "Mo" May-Grimm is running in next year's Democratic primary for the 51st State Assembly District seat held by Howard Marklein. May-Grimm is currently in her second term on the Mineral Point School Board, where she continually seeks to find "the delicate balance between making certain our kids receive a guality education, while being mindful of the impact this will have on taxpayers." She grew up on a rural Mineral Point farm settled by her great grandfather. But the family farm "was sold on the courthouse steps" when she was 14. "I learned many valuable lessons from that experience." A 1980 MPHS graduate, Mo lived in Illinois and Ohio before returning to Mineral Point in 1988 where she first worked the phones at Lands' End while putting herself through UW-Platteville. She graduated from there Summa Cum Laude with a degree in management/HR management and a minor in psychology. During the next 17 years May-Grimm worked her way up to Senior Operators Analyst at Lands End before moving to Conney Safety Products in Madison. Laid off after four years, it didn't take her long to land her present position as Project Manager at IBM in Dubuque. Mo's 16-year-old daughter, Maggie, is supportive of her mom's interest in running for office. Mo May-Grimm says, "I hope to have the opportunity to provide the leadership we clearly need in Madison."
