## JUDGE HAS HALTED NEW VOTER ID LAW for APRIL 3 ELECTION (See below)

<u>BIG NEWS:</u> Dane County Judge David Flanagan temporarily halted implementation of Wisconsin's controversial new voter ID law for the April 3 election - although Attorney General Van Hollen is appealing.
