SERIOUSLY: An all-Iowa County Campaign? Grassroots and a number of other community partners are hosting a forum to explore the idea of a coordinated all-county wellness campaign that could save lives -- and

potentially health care costs. Our presenters will be Dana Churchill and Sarah Ritchie of RichlandFIT. Dana and Sarah will tell about Richland County's four-year wellness campaign (<a href="http://richlandfit.co.richland.wi.us/">http://richlandfit.co.richland.wi.us/</a>), funded by a major grant from the Wisconsin Partnership Program. Its mission is to create a healthier Richland County for all residents by addressing the county's high rates of overweight and obesity, the chronic diseases associated with excess weight and the key issues and barriers (the same problems Iowa County faces.) The entire Richland County community is on board - the schools, the hospital and medical community, Health and Human Services Department, UW-Extension, Parks and Recreation, 4-H, local businesses, the local radio station -- to name a few of the partners.
