Now that Wisconsin law prohibits dumping TV sets, computers and other electronics into landfills, "Clean Sweep Days" becomes even more important.

Here are the facts on upcoming "Clean Sweeps" in Lancaster (Sept. 11 at Agriliance Agronomy Center), Dodgeville (Sept. 18 at Iowa Cty. Highway Dept.) and Darlington (Sept. 25 at the Lafayette Ct. Highway Dept.) PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED for any unwanted chemicals, herbicides, poison, or other hazardous wastes. Businesses and local governments can also contract for waste disposal. Because budgets have been cut, fees will be \$10 for 1 to 10 pounds, \$40 for 11 to 50 pounds, and up from there. TV sets, computers and other major and minor appliances and hard-to-discard equipment will also be collected. For times, fees and pre-
