<u>U.S. Senate Candidates Tammy Baldwin and Tommy Thompson</u> debate this Friday, Sept. 28, from 8 to 10 p.m. on channels 21 (PBS) and 27 (ABC). The two will debate again on Thurs., October 18 (7 to 8 p.m. on PBS) and on Friday, October 26.

The first of three Obama-Romney presidential debates is next week - Wed., Oct. 3 from 8 to 10 p.m. on all major channels. The topic will be domestic issues with PBS's Jim Lehrer moderating. On Tues., Oct. 16 from 8 to 9:30 p.m. they'll debate foreign and domestic policy, in a town hall format, with Candy Crowley from CNN moderating (all major channels). On Monday, October 22, from 8 to 9:30 p.m. the topic will be foreign policy, with CBS's Bob Schieffer moderating (all major channels).

<u>Vice President Joe Biden and Paul Ryan</u> will debate foreign and domestic policy on Thurs., Oct. 11, from 8 to 10 p.m., with ABC's Martha Raddatz moderating. The debate will be shown on all major channels.

- 1) Vote early to avoid the lines. (From Mon., Oct. 22 to Fri. Nov. 2, your local clerk can issue absentee ballots for early voting <u>in person</u> at his/her office. Also get an absentee ballot from your clerk if you'll be out of town.)
- 2) Register to vote online and help others do so. (It's a new quick and easy method.)

- 3) Find excellent, nonpartisan information on the candidates. This information has been compiled from WPT and WPR broadcasts and other sources.
- 4) Find out exactly who you will be voting for and where -- by entering your street address. A sample of your ballot will come up. You'll be prepared when you walk in the voting booth.
- 5) Discover if you are in a new Congressional or State Assembly district. You may be surprised. Many redistricting changes have been made.
- 6) Find out about the Dodgeville School Referendum and the upcoming listening sessions.
