Wed., April 10, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Wisconsin Dells) GOV. WALKER'S BUDGET - LET YOUR OPINIONS BE HEARD. One of four statewide Joint Finance Committee hearings on Gov. Walker's budget will be held at the Kalahari Convention Center, 1305 Kalahari Drive, Suites 2 and 7 (main level). This is an important opportunity for citizens to let their voices be heard.
